## What Is HCUP?

The Healthcare Cost and Utilization Project (HCUP, pronounced "H-cup") is a family of health care databases and related software tools and products developed through a Federal State industry partnership and sponsored by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality. HCUP is based on statewide data collected by individual data organizations across the United States and provided to AHRQ through the HCUP partnership. HCUP would not be possible without statewide data collection projects. HCUP includes the largest collection of longitudinal hospital care data in the United States, encompassing all-payer, discharge-level information.

HCUP data are used for research on hospital utilization, access, charges, quality, and outcomes. The data are used to describe patterns of care for uncommon as well as common diseases; to analyze hospital procedures, including those that are performed infrequently; and to study the care of population sub-groups such as minorities, children, women, and uninsured people. Researchers and policymakers use HCUP data to identify, track, analyze, and compare hospital statistics at the national, regional, and State levels.

# Get Accurate Results Fast

Using HCUPnet, you can quickly generate tables and graphs on national and regional statistics and trends for community hospitals in the United States.

## Step 1

### What kind of data are you looking for?

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Are you interested in hospital inpatient, emergency department, or ambulatory surgery data? Do you want to see statistics about specific conditions or procedures, trends over time, or ranking of diagnoses or procedures?

## Step 2

### Do you want information on a specific diagnosis or procedure?

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What specific diagnosis, surgery, or diagnostic test are you interested in—or are you interested in statistics about all patients in general?

## Step 3

### Create your analysis

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Create an analysis and see results after making only a few selections. You can refine your analysis as needed.

## Step 4

### View and update your data results in real time

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Once results are displayed, you can use the navigation bar on the left to make changes to your analysis. Select outcomes and measures; see results by patient or hospital characteristics; change your setting of care, the geographic setting, or the year of your analysis; show results for subgroups; or change the diagnosis or procedures being shown.

## Step 5

### View your results in detailed graphs

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Each table generated may be graphed. Use controls on the graph to change the patient or hospital characteristic and outcome being graphed.

## Step 6

### Export your data for future use

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Export your results in Excel format to analyze your data further.
